






## Importance to UK Food Chain

33% of England's crop production including:

96% of sugar beet
57% English vegetables
45% English potatoes
31% English oilseed rape
30% England protein crops
30% English wheat
30% English ornamental plants and flowers





Food chain supports more than 150,000 jobs across the region.



The Fens has half of the UK's Grade 1 soils, with over 90% of the Fenland soils Grades 1 or 2; Lincolnshire alone accounts for 25% of grade 1 arable land; and 80% of Norfolk and Suffolk's land is Grades 1, 2 or 3.

English seed crops.

Agricultural output £5.1billion in 2019, a quarter of the English total.



16% of English livestock production, worth £1.6billion in 2019 – including 30% of English pig production and 39% of English poultry.



More than 50% of all UK fish processing is in Grimsby, worth over £2 billion per year. Cluster supports 65 processors and with linked distribution companies employs more than 10,000 staff.







## New Innovators in agri-tech and food technology, Eastern England







Your business must be active or growing innovation activities in the agri-tech and food technology cluster in Eastern England.

Your project can focus on one or more of the following:

- enhancing the productivity of primary crops, livestock, aquaculture or ornamental crops
- biotechnologies related to agriculture, aquaculture, food processing and nutrition
- food that promotes safe, lower carbon or more sustainable healthy and nutritious diets
- resource efficient production and processing methods for low emission foods

This list is not exhaustive. Where you can show your proposal fits within the scope of this competition you can focus on other themes.





#### **Portfolio approach**

We want to fund a variety of projects across different durations, locations and themes. We call this a portfolio approach.

In support of the UK government's Levelling Up goals, we reserve the right to prioritise projects that:

- significantly advance innovation (the idea)
- have more innovation activity taking place within the innovation cluster or outside of the Greater South East
- achieve a balance between the specific themes for this competition


